Deans Office

Dean Chavelli's office is located on the 2nd floor of West Dorm. Dean Mekezie's office is located on the 2nd floor of East Dorm. The Dean's office should not be occupied without a dean present or without approval from the dean.

Dean on Duty

The Dean on Duty will be posted on the West/East Dorm Office Door. Please make a note of who is on duty daily so that you can contact the correct dean as needed. The dean on duty, if not in the dean's office, can always be reached on her cell phone (the number will be posted in the lobby).



RA (Resident assistants)

"RA's" serve as the assistants to the Deans. RA's are in charge of making sure Study Halls run effectively and smoothly, mentor residents, enforce dorm policies, complete room cleanliness checks, plan dorm workshops and activities, tutor, spiritually mentor, as well as other duties as assigned by the dean. Reasonable requests by the RA to a resident are expected to be followed.

Dean's List

Dean's List is provided so that you are capable of earning greater privilege and freedom within the dorm. This program seeks to establish accountability and clear expectations. In order to enjoy the benefits of being on Dean's List, a resident must maintain a GPA of 3.5 and above. She must also have acceptable citizenship, class attendance and dorm program scores. Dean's List will be posted every 4 1/2 weeks in the Dorm. Dean's List residents will receive special privileges during Study Halls and in the dorm program. Specific Dean's List privileges will be determined by the Deans.

Our EXPECTATIONS for The Dorms

Check in procedure

Your assigned room will be your personal space for the rest of the academic year. You are welcome to decorate it with appropriate pictures, posters and bedding. To ensure we all take care of our personal spaces so others can enjoy it after you as well, we ask you to complete the check in form and return this to the dean. This will prevent you from being charged for existing damages. Complete your own form regardless if you have a roommate or not.

Key

Each resident will receive a room key when they are assigned a room in the dormitory. If a student loses their key, there will be a \$25 re-keying fee.

Dorm Surveillance

There are video cameras placed throughout the dorm for your protection. Do not tamper with any video camera.

Men's Dormitory

Men's Dormitory is off limits without the Dean's permission. If you need to go to the Men's Dormitory, please call the Men's Dean to gain permission and then ask the Dean on Duty.

Dorm Worship

Dorm Worship is a reverent time spent in the company of Jesus. We want to spend this precious time with the Lord fully focused on Him. Residents are expected to be quiet and respectful. Dorm Worship is held Sunday through Thursday at 7:10pm. The weekly schedule is as follows:

Sunday: Song Service
Monday: Girls Club
Tuesday: Hall Worship
Wednesday: Guest Speaker
Thursday: Head RA Worship

Fish are the only pets students are allowed to have in the dormitory at the deans discretion.

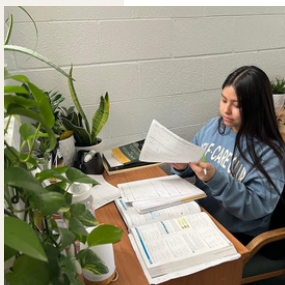
Room Cleanliness Check

Rooms will be checked for cleanliness daily between 9:00am and 3:00pm. You will receive a room score between 1-10. A score of 6 or less is failing. If you fail your room check 3 times in a month, you will be required to deep clean your room and have it approved by the dean on duty. On Fridays, two men from the Men's Dorm will complete room check escorted by an RA while two ladies will do room check in the Men's Dorm. There is no room check on Sabbath or Sunday. Room scores are tallied and students with the highest scores receive special privileges determined by the dean.



Room Searches

We value your privacy and will do our best to respect your space. However, we reserve the right to conduct room searches at any time with or without reason. If there is a room search, you may or may not be present. To ensure fairness, there will always be two adult staff members involved in any room search.



Sleepovers

Sleepovers are only allowed on Saturday nights subject to dean's approval. Only 4 people per room total are allowed.

Study Hall

Weeknight hours in the dorm are structured to provide the best possible setting for academic success. Strict Study Hall: Students are expected to be in their rooms studying or reading quietly. Relaxed Study Hall: Students are allowed to visit other rooms and participate in leisure activities. If activity or noise levels become distracting to other dorm students, they may be asked to return to their room or discontinue their activity.

Our EXPECTATIONS *For The Dorms continued*

Down grades

Downgrades Study Hall: Students who show the need for increased structure and assistance in their studies will be assigned to Downgrades Study Hall. This includes grades of D or less. Student will be required to spend their study hall time in the lobby with Tutors. While lower grades result in required tutoring, tutoring and additional study support is available for any student desiring assistance in reaching her personal academic goals.

Sick List

If a dorm student is sick, they need to report to the nurse between 6:15-6:45am to be evaluated. Once placed on sick list, they are excused from the entire day of class &/or work. They are expected to have no visitors or visit other rooms and remain resting during the entire day, including evening recreation and other dorm activities. Using the bathroom facilities is acceptable. The dean on duty and RAs will coordinate to bring the student their meals from the cafeteria.

Room Furnishing

Each dorm room is furnished for two students, containing two twin XL beds, two dressers and desks, closet space, and a sink area. Students are welcome to bring decorative items to help personalize their space. While reflecting the character and style of each woman is supported, items that do not uphold Christian values are discouraged. Displaying items that devalues race, gender, religion or human life will not be tolerated.

Communal Areas

We want you to feel at home--pajamas and all! However, during hours prior to study hall there will be deliveries, maintenance, family, faculty and staff that may pass through our doors. It is expected that you dress appropriately from 7:30am - 7:30pm. Modest pajamas or a robe are appropriate after 7:30pm, weekends, and when on sick list.

Room Air-Conditioner

You are not to touch the A/C units in your rooms in any way. Please inform the dean if you need the temperature adjusted.

Bulletin Boards

Dormitory bulletins/whiteboards are where important school and dormitory announcements are posted. It is expected that each resident will be responsible for the information posted. A dean must approve all material that is posted on the dorm bulletin boards. Please do not remove anything from the bulletin boards or draw on the whiteboards without a Dean's permission. This Week at IA, a schedule of weekend events and activities will be posted on Thursday of each week detailing what is going on that weekend.

The Laundry

The dorm is blessed to be able to offer free laundry facilities with washers and dryers. It is expected that you be prompt in moving your laundry from the units so that they will be available for other residents to utilize.

The Dorm Store

Deans will try to have the dorm store open each evening following worship or as time allows. A variety of food items are available.

Appliances

There are a few appliances students may want to bring. Hair dryers, curlers, curling irons, small lamps, fans, small heaters, and electric blankets are welcome. All appliances must have an automatic shut off. We provide an iron and ironing board for use in the laundry room. Outlet extenders or power strips are allowed if they have a shut off/breaker built in. Surge protectors are also allowed, but must have automatic shutoff.

Our EXPECTATIONS *For prohibited items*

Prohibited Items

Toasters, electric fry pans, electric hot plates, electric water kettles, coffee makers without automatic shutoff, unprotected light bulbs, and irons.

Please note that having the following items in your room will result in a \$50 cash fine. This list is not exclusive, and items may be added if they are deemed a fire danger or inappropriate for student use.

- Lighters
- Matches
- Candles
- Incense
- Toasters
- Electric fry pan
- Electric hot pots/plates
- TVs/VCR/DVD/ or Blu-ray players
- Knives/weapons (air and paint guns included)



Hair Dye

Dying hair in the dorm is prohibited and will result in a \$100 dollar cash fine. Students who wish to color their hair should do so at home in accordance with IA policy.

Drugs and substances use

Illegal drug and substance use, as well as alcohol use, is not permitted. Please see the IA Source Book for Indiana Academy's Drug and Substance Policy.

Our EXPECTATIONS *for Personal Items*



Bicycles

Bicycles are not to be stored in common areas of the Dorm. It is your responsibility to find proper storage for your bike. If you have a question, please ask a dean.

Mobile Phones & Personal Media Devices

Per Indiana Academy policy, ALL residents will be required to turn in their cell phones (and any personal media device) upon arrival to campus. The phones will be stored in a secure and locked area until the resident leaves campus. See IA Sourcebook for complete policy.



Space Heaters

You may bring a portable space heater during the colder months. These portable space heaters should be ceramic style or fan-forced air. NO OIL/GAS OR EXPOSED HEATING COIL-STYLE HEATERS. All space heaters will be reported to the Dean when brought into the Dorm.

Sports Equipment

Sports equipment of any kind is not to be used inside the dormitory. Please remove your cleats/muddy shoes when entering the building. Please do your best to clean your muddy cleats/shoes outside before entering the dorm. Cleat cleaners will be placed outside of each dormitory during outside sports season. Do not leave cleats or any shoes or equipment outside or inside the dorm entrance at any time.

Lost & Found

Found items will be kept in the Head Dean's office. The bin will be "up for grabs" on homeleave day each month. Any unclaimed item will be then donated to Goodwill.



Our EXPECTATIONS *For prohibited behaviour*

Window Screens

Tampering with the window screens in any manner will result in discipline and will be charged a \$50 fine for repair/replacement.

Entrance & Exits

Students are to use the main lobby entrance at all times. The south exit is to be used for emergencies only. All doors have alarms that will be armed overnight. Anyone entering or leaving the building in an unauthorized way is subject to discipline.

Fighting/Hazing/Harassment/Bullying

Fighting of any kind is not tolerated and will result in immediate discipline. Hazing, initiations, bullying or intimidation of any kind or form will not be tolerated and will result in immediate discipline with possible dismissal from IA. Anyone who knowingly commits any act that injures, degrades, or intends to injure a fellow student (including hitting, shoving, wrestling, etc.) will be subject to immediate discipline including dismissal. Please note that cyber bullying and defaming someone's character are also subject to immediate discipline. If you need any clarification in this matter, or feel you are being harassed, please come see a dean. We do not take this matter lightly. The deans and administration are very serious about this issue. This dorm will not have these acts be a part of the culture here.

Fire Alarms

Unauthorized activation of fire alarms will result in severe disciplinary action and a fine.

Fire Extinguisher

Fire Extinguishers are provided for your safety. Unauthorized discharge of a fire extinguisher will result in severe disciplinary action and a fine.

Theft

If you are discovered to have stolen any property, you will receive immediate discipline, which will include restitution to the individual(s) you stole from and you will be referred to the Administrative Committee for further discipline.

Selling Goods and Services

Selling goods and services is prohibited. Exceptions can be made with the Dean's permission.

Addressing the Dean

The deans are to be addressed as dean Chavelli and dean Mekenzie.

Language

Foul language is inappropriate and has no place in a civilized, Christian society. If you don't know if what you are about to say is inappropriate, play it safe and don't say it.

Hygiene

It is expected that you will stay on top of keeping yourself, your laundry and your room clean. Please be respectful to your God for giving you a healthy body. Be respectful to your neighbors by regularly brushing your teeth, showering (WITH SHAMPOO/SOAP), wearing deodorant and doing your laundry.



Dorm Chores

Each night (Saturday-Thursday), RAs will rotate responsibility to each room to sweep steps, vacuum halls, take out trash and clean bathrooms



For Discipline

Dorm Discipline

It is expected that all residents comply with the expectations outlined in this Handbook and the IA Sourcebook. If a resident is in need of disciplinary action, the deans will meet to investigate and discuss the issue and appropriate action will be taken which could include be taken to the Administrative Discipline Committee. All dorm discipline issues can result in a Conduct Notation that will affect your school citizenship grade and your standing as a student at Indiana Academy.

Our EXPECTATIONS *For Dress*

Dress

It is expected that all residents are in appropriate dress code at all times. Skirts, shorts and dresses need to be on or below the knees. Dresses and skirts should not be body hugging. The back, shoulders and bust should be appropriately covered. All ladies are expected to have a robe for visiting the showers.

Jewelry

Jewelry is not part of our dress code and should therefore not be worn on campus or in the dorm.

Make-up

Modest make-up is allowed provided it "enhances" your natural beauty. Clear nail polish is allowed on both fingers and toes.

Village Students

Flexi Boarding

The dormitories are closed to village students at 7:30pm on weeknights, after Vespers on Friday and after the Saturday night activity on Sabbaths unless given permission by the dean on duty. Please Note: village students are required to attend dorm Worship if in the Dorms during worship time.

Parents of any village student wishing for their daughter to stay in the dorm must notify the dean and be approved of in a timely manner. There will be a \$10 charge for village students staying the dorm overnight. Again, the resident takes responsibility for the behavior of the visitor while in the Dorm.

Our EXPECTATIONS *For Leave*



Home Leave Procedure

During home leaves, no one will be allowed to stay in the dorm. All residents must stay with parent(s) or guardians. If plans are made to stay with someone other than your parent(s) or guardian, parental permission needs to be obtained. Communication regarding transportation, departure and arrival times, and supervision needs to be clearly communicated directly to the dean via written permission with parental signature. The dorm is closed from 2:00pm on a home leave day and reopens at 4pm on the last day of Home Leave.

Closed Weekends

You will notice closed weekends marked on the Indiana Academy online calendar. Please do not make plans that conflict with organized programming during these important weekends. Weekend leaves submitted for closed weekends must be completed by Monday prior for approval by Administrative Council.

Excused Absences

There is special permission needed for occasions when classes, work, or required school programs will be missed. Details of leave must be communicated on an excused absence form, which is to be turned in to the administrative office. Teachers and work supervisor(s) will need to sign the form. Please see administration for requirements.

Weekend Leaves

All weekend leaves end at 9:00pm on Sunday night. Once a student has returned to campus from an approved leave, her leave is terminated. A leave slip must be filled out and turned in to the dean by noon on the Thursday prior to the leave. Written permission from the parent must be received by noon on the Thursday prior to the leave. A copy of the leave slip signed by the Dean will be returned to the student confirming that she has permission to leave campus. An authorized driver who is at least 21 years old must sign out the student. Upon return to campus, the student is responsible to sign back in.

Our EXPECTATIONS *for leave continued*

Day Leave

Off-Campus Leave Permission Form (filled out at registration) can fill this requirement. Written permission from the parent must be received prior to the student leaving campus. A dean MUST give permission before the student may leave campus. An authorized driver who is at least 21 years old must sign out the student. Upon return to campus, the driver must sign the student back in. All weekday leaves on a school night end at 7:00 pm unless the student is with immediate family. Students are expected to attend worship services and be at study hall unless with immediate family. Exceptions: Senior Privilege exclusion must have appropriate approvals. All students must follow the sign-out procedure to walk to the Three Angels Book store or thrift store.

School Sponsored Trips

The trip supervisor will complete a form to be submitted to the Administrative Committee. Once approved, a copy of this form will be given to the Dean. If a resident is listed on this form and is NOT going on the trip, it is the resident's responsibility to notify the Dean.

There is no need to sign out of the Dorm or complete a Leave Slip for school sponsored trips.

Our EXPECTATIONS *For Spending Time with Jesus*



Music

Indiana Academy's music policy is meant to guard the residents against music that leads many away from Jesus. We believe that while music can be a powerful tool for the Lord, unfortunately, the devil can use it in a powerful way as well.

Personal Devotion

Spending personal time with Jesus is an important part of the Christian life. We encourage you to schedule daily devotions as part of your day.

Sabbath Activities & Programming

Students are expected to be on time for Friday Night Vespers, Sabbath School, Worship Services, and Hallowed Moments. You must be in the meeting area (not in the bathroom) to be considered present.

Electronic Device Usage & Policies

As a Christian school, we strongly encourage careful choices to be made regarding all media viewing. Content that emphasizes values in opposition to the Bible is discouraged. All students and their parents will be required to read and sign an Acceptable Use Policy regarding media.

Our EXPECTATIONS *For Support and Activities*

Girls` Club

Girls' Club offers a variety of activities and outings for the residents throughout the year. Every year officers will be elected and will serve as club organizers.

Community/Charity Involvement

We would like to support you in being an active citizen in your community. Over the years you will learn that giving back brings joy. As a dorm we will therefore pick a community activity each term to support. Please start thinking about which charity or activity you enjoy getting involved in.

Example of Activities Rota

During your busy week you might not have much time to spend quality time with the ladies in the dorm. On Sundays we would like to dedicate specific time to spend quality time with everyone. Together we can decide what activities to organize. Think about activities like baking, knitting, hair braiding or spa afternoons. Let us know what you would enjoy as a group and we will try our best to make it happen.



Our EXPECTATIONS *For Standard Protocols*



Emergencies

If a student has a medical or other emergency they should notify the nearest IA Staff member. The dean on duty should also be notified immediately.

Fire Drills

Fire Drills will take place on a regular basis. The appropriate exit information is posted on each room door. Please become familiar with the Dorm and Fire Exit routes so that you will know where to go in case of alarm.

Lights Out

At lights out check, you are expected to be in your own room, be prepared to sleep, use quiet voices not heard outside your room, and lights off. Any exception must be requested of the Dean.

Locked Rooms

Students are advised to lock their room at all times. Please remember to take your keys with you when you leave the dorm. There is a \$1 fee to unlock room doors.

Incoming mail will be collected by the Dean on duty and distributed before Study Hall. Outgoing mail must have the appropriate postage and should be dropped off in the Administration building.

Messages

Messages left for students while in class or work will be written out and delivered to the student in a timely manner.

Our EXPECTATIONS *For Standard Protocols Continued*

Medication

All medication will be kept in a locked cabinet in the deans office. Prescription medication will be dispensed by the school nurse or the dean on duty. Nonprescription medication will be dispensed in accordance with the parent/guardian's expressed written permission.

Maintenance

The deans make every attempt to keep the residence hall in working order. However, if you notice something that needs to be fixed, please report it to the dean on duty. If the damage is simply normal "wear and tear", the student will not be charged for the repairs.

Ordering Food

All food delivery must be approved by a dean prior to ordering and must be delivered before worship.

Phone Usage

Students can be reached by calling (317) 984-0071 The dean on duty can be reached by calling (317) 984-0070 Phone calls during Strict Study Hall are restricted to calls with immediate family when deemed absolutely necessary.

Vehicles

Please see the IA Sourcebook for the full vehicle policy. All residents are required to turn in their car keys to the Dean when a car is brought to campus. Keys will be released to the student with parental permission. Student is to return the keys immediately upon return to campus. Failure to comply with the Vehicle policy can result in loss of vehicle privileges.

Visitors

Visitors must have permission from the dean on duty before visiting residents in the dorm. Parents, please be sensitive to the privacy of the other dorm residents when visiting your daughter. Males-even fathers-are not allowed in students rooms without prior permission from Dean. Students are not to visit the Mens' Dorm unless both deans have given permission. A dean must approve any overnight visitor. Overnight visitors will follow all dorm rules and policies.

IN CLOSING

This academic year, plant trees you will never see. Choose to leave behind a legacy that will inspire all those who will follow you.

At the moment you may feel overwhelmed with all the information we just gave you. You might not even agree with some of the rules and policies we have in the dorm. Trust and believe life in the dorm will soon become second nature to you and we believe you will appreciate the safety and security these expectations and rules provide.
